NON-ACTION ITEMS

- 1. COVID-19 Update
 - 1. Dr. Miriam McDonell and Martha McInnes updated the board on the current COVID-19 status.
 - 2. Wasco, Sherman, and Gilliam continue to have high case counts.
 - 3. Total case count by County:
 - a) Wasco Co.: Total Cases: 2758 (10.1%); Deaths: 39
 - b) Sherman Co.: Total Cases: 145 (7.4%); Deaths: 3
 - c) Gilliam Co.: Total Cases: 148 (7.5%); Deaths: 4
 - 4. Vaccination rates by County:
 - a) Wasco 69.0%
 - b) Sherman 64.3%
 - c) Gilliam 47.9%
 - d) Hood River 80.7%
 - 5. NCPHD Response:
 - a) NCPHD is back at the Readiness Center: All 3 vaccine types are offered.
 - b) Vaccine Clinics will continue at schools and other sites in all three counties.
 - Online booking is available at: call: (541) 506-2600 or go to https://www.ncphd.org/book-vaccine.
 - c) Testing, case investigation, contact tracing, and school support continues.
 - 6. Other Topics:
 - a) Boosters: Currently the Pfizer vaccine is the only vaccine approved for boosters. J&J and the Moderna vaccine boosters are under discussion and waiting for approval.
 - b) Vaccine #3, for both Pfizer and Moderna, is now available for immunocompromised individuals.
 - c) Children 5 11 vaccinations are also under discussion and waiting for approval.
 - d) New oral antiviral medication by Merck & Co. Molnupiravir is submitting for Emergency Use Approval immediately. Reported to cut the risk of hospitalization and/or death by 50%.
 - e) Communications focus continues with the efforts to ensure the distribution of accurate information (and combating misinformation). Information is posted to: NCPHD website,

various social media, PSA's, video conferences and other information sources.

f) OAR 339-019-1010

- A health care provider or healthcare staff person may not work, learn, study, assist, observe, or volunteer in a healthcare setting unless they are fully vaccinated or have provided documentation of a medical or religious exception.
- On or before October 18, 2021, healthcare providers and healthcare staff must provide their employer, contractor or responsible party with either:
 - o Proof of vaccination showing they are fully vaccinated; or
 - Documentation of a medical or religious exception.
- Employers of healthcare providers or healthcare staff, contractors and responsible parties who grant an exception to the vaccination requirement under section (4) of this rule must take reasonable steps to ensure that unvaccinated healthcare providers and healthcare staff are protected from contracting and spreading COVID-19.
- Some safety measures include requiring unvaccinated workers to wear N-95 masks, be physically distanced from others, get periodic tests for COVID-19, and accept reassignment.
- 7. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.

2. Fiscal Report FY 2020-2021

- 1. Brita Meyer reviewed the COVID funding amounts for October 2021, 2022 2023 with the Board.
 - a) Beginning balance: \$2,117,048.
 - b) YTD Personal Services expenses: \$225,004.
 - c) YTD Materials and supplies expenses: \$124,565.
 - d) Total expenditure: \$349,569.
 - e) YTD Balance: \$1,767,479.
- 2. NCPHD on track for YTD at this time.
- 3. There have been no funding updates from OHA recently.
- 4. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.
- 3. Gilliam County feasibility study work session update by Commissioner Pat Shannon
 - 1. The work session was held in Arlington on September 29th, 2021.
 - 2. It was brought to Gilliam County Court on October 6, 2021 for review.
 - 3. The general consensus resulting from the study was that it is feasible for Gilliam County to begin its own Public Health Authority to provide public health services to individuals and families within Gilliam County.
 - 4. The plan is for Gilliam County Court to make the decision to move forward at the November 2021 county court meeting.
 - 5. Gilliam County would then begin the steps to establish their own Public Health Department.
 - 6. Gilliam County would notify NCPHD by December 31, 2021 of their intent to dissolve the IGA contract. Gilliam County would then have 180 days to ensure the transfer of public health services from NCPHD to Gilliam County effective as of July 1, 2022, the beginning of the new fiscal year.
 - 7. Discussion, questions, and feedback were requested.

8. Contracts Summary

1. FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT between Glenda Clark and North Central Public Health District. This agreement is to amend the original professional services agreement to cover

project support around accounting and financial duties and reimbursement for spousal respite care.

- a. Fiscal Impact: Cost not to exceed \$10,000.
- 2. AGREEMENT between Samoa Pacific Development Corporation (SPDC) and North Central Public Health District (NCPHD) to establish the responsibilities of SPDC and NCPHD with regard to community engagement, education, and outreach activities related to the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - a. Fiscal Impact: Cost to NCPHD is \$15,000.
- 3. **AGREEMENT between Tim Fransen and North Central Public Health District.** This agreement is for contracted services to provide project support around COVID-19 Testing Implementation.
 - a. Fiscal Impact: Not to exceed \$30,000.
- 6. Directors Report
 - 1. Shellie Campbell presented the Directors report to the Board.

Note 1: I have been a full-time resident of South Wasco Co (specifically Maupin) for only 4 years, but I have been actively connected to the community and a part-time resident since 2001.

Note 2: I first became aware of NCPHD through your COVID email newsletter. I found it to be a useful source of information regarding vaccines and the state of the pandemic in our local community. As a resident of South Wasco, access to information and resources of any kind is often limited at best, simply because of our physical (and to some extent cultural) distance from larger urban areas and the county seat. As a rural and economically depressed area, access to public health programs is a necessary lifeline for many of our residents. I'm a former WIC and MediCal recipient myself; as the child of a disabled single mother I know first-hand how essential these programs are and how much value they return on their investment. I also know that many of our residents are unaware of what resources are available to them through NCPHD, or how to connect to them. There are also some residents that have deep misconceptions about such services and those that use them. I believe that access to nutritious food, quality health care (including reproductive heath care), clean water, and breathable air are all basic human rights and not a "handout" or a luxury. It is my hope that by serving on the NCPHD board I can serve as an advocate for the benefits of public health and a conduit of accurate information between South Wasco and the larger community.

NCPHD Directors Report for Board of Health Meeting of November 9, 2021

And, in a blink of an eye it is fall! It has been a beautiful change of the season; the colors we get to experience in The Gorge are remarkable. It has lifted our spirits.

With the change of season we are also seeing many changes in the COVID world. New guidelines from the CDC, and vaccine approvals, and boosters are keeping us busy. The vaccine team at NCPHD was ready and went right to work expanding clinics at the Readiness Center and in Gilliam and Sherman Counties. We are now planning in anticipation of the approval for children years 5 to 11 to receive the vaccine. We are working closely with local providers to administer the vaccine to youth. Research supports parents prefer having their children see their local PCP for vaccines. We will also provide vaccine here as we always have for community members that do not have access to a local provider.

NPCHD COVID Team continues to provide COVID testing Monday – Friday and is working with OHA and schools to support their testing needs. The Team also works daily providing case investigation, contact tracing and wraparound services, as needed. We have seen a decrease in positive cases, which we are hopeful, will continue. Our numbers are following the trend in Oregon. We will continue to plan for a potential surge that may occur after the holidays.

As COVID has consumed us all for the past 20 months we also focus on the overall mission of public health. The NCPHD staff has continued to provide home visiting services, seeing clients virtually and most recently at the park, or in their home (with safety guidelines in place). The WIC staff has carried a full load and continues to ensure clients receive support and benefits. Our walk-in clinic is open two days a week to provide services outside the COVID world. And, our EH Team is back in the field with inspections.

Speaking of our EH Team, we congratulate Paula Grendel and Eric Grendel for their completion and passing of the EH Certification to become Environmental Health Specialist. They have worked hard over the last two years to complete this work. We are very happy to have them on our Team!

The NCPHD staff has all moved back to in person work, but is ready and able if needed to move to remote. A lesson learned from the pandemic. We can do this. But, we know we are better together!

We look forward to a quiet holiday season and look towards a healthy, calm new year. Thank you to our board of health for your continued support.
