WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

1. MINUTES

- a. Approval of past meeting minutes
 - 5/10/2016 minutes were approved as presented.
 - 9/13/2016 minutes were approved as presented.
 - 10/12/2016 minutes were approved as presented.

b. Set next meeting date

- A full board meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, December 13, 2016 at 3:00 PM. Meeting location will be at the North Central Public Health District office located at 419 E. 7th Street, The Dalles, OR.
- Teri advised the board that she will not be present at the December board of health meeting but will have someone from Leadership team attend in her absence.

2. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

a. None

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

a. None

4. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- a. Status of Accreditation
 - a. Teri is currently in negotiations with our past accreditation coordinator to come back and work, in a very part-time status, to be project manager on this project. The CCO money that had been targeted to be used to cover the cost of other staff besides Teri for on call duty will be used to cover the cost of funding this position instead. We continue to move forward in this process.
 - b. It was asked after we do become accredited, and then maintaining the accreditation, what does this mean financially? What will the cost be?
 - i. The original application was around \$2,000.00 for five years of accreditation and Teri believes this amount is the current rate. This will be a cost that we will have to consider if we can afford to budget for it or not in the future.
 - c. It was asked if there is any additional revenue that can be wrapped around the accreditation.
 - i. Teri responded not at this point; however the thought is, that every other health system that has become accredited such as hospitals, mental health, clinics, it will eventually become compulsory to get Medicaid funding. At some point, it may put us ahead of the curve to be able to receive Medicaid funding.

b. Staffing Update

- a. Environmental Health Specialist Trainee position has been posted.
- b. We posted this position as a .8 FTE; however Hood River County Health Department has expressed an interest in cross jurisdictional sharing of this position which would bring it up to a full-time position.
- c. This position will be required to work Saturdays which will help to take the burden off of the current EH staff that has to work events on the week-ends.

c. CHA-CHIP Update

- a. Eastern Oregon CCO is finalizing their CHA-CHIP. They did not do a complete re-assessment, they just did an update.
- b. Columbia Gorge CCO did do a full community health assessment that actually surveyed the five counties in the Early Learning HUB. Because NCPHD is a partner, the original assessment included Sherman and Gilliam Counties. Teri explained that because Wheeler County is now in the Four-Rivers Early Learning HUB, and Gilliam and Sherman Counties were already being surveyed there was a request to include Wheeler County in the survey. There was discussion with the Wheeler County local community advisory council and they agreed to that. So we will be able to not only pull out regional health information but we're going to be able to pull out five county information for the HUB out of this assessment as well.
- c. The draft assessment has gone to the community advisory council and they hope to have it finalized by December; then the CHIP will come from that.

- d. Teri will send the draft out to the board of health.
- d. Air Quality Update
 - a. We continue to work around the issue with Ameri Ties West and the air quality. On Saturday, November 5th DEQ and OHA had an open house for the public. It was a "listening session" to hear people's concerns. The manager of Ameri Ties was in attendance as well.
 - b. The Public Health Division is going to do a health consultation to provide additional information around whether there may be a health issue or not. They will be working with the agency for toxic substances and disease registry.
 - c. Teri believes that air quality monitoring will continue and that Ameri Ties is changing their formulation and their process should be changed as of December 1st.
- e. Public Health Modernization Status Update
 - a. 2ND half of this meeting will be held on November 21st at City Hall.
 - i. This meeting will concentrate on cross jurisdictional sharing; what are those opportunities; what do they look like; and how do we make that happen.

5. **NEW BUSINESS**

- a. MCMC Health Summit Reflections & Report Presented by Dr. Mimi McDonell
 - Meeting Objectives:
 - ✓ A shared understanding of the facts regarding breadth and depth of existing community health services;
 - ✓ A document for use by the county commissioners and public health agencies as an input into the modernization work expected of public health in the coming months and years;
 - ✓ A list of shared action items that can be used by the participants back in their respective organizations for advocacy for change; and
 - ✓ Clarity on where community-wide convergence exists and where divergence continues.
 - Key Points and Further Work:
 - ✓ Desire to optimize resources for the community as a whole;
 - ✓ Desire to improve communication between agencies:
 - Regarding services offered
 - Around "closing the loop" on referrals;
 - Recognition that some duplication of services is necessary
 - Public Health can be viewed as providing some "specialty care";
 - ✓ Need to identify individuals/populations who are medically underserved (gaps);
 - ✓ DHS children in foster care requiring medical services in a timely fashion; and
 - ✓ Inclusion of mental health services.
 - Commissioner Hege shared that he thought this was a good first step.

WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

1. MINUTES / NEXT MEETING DATE

- a. Approval of past meeting minutes
 - November minutes not completed.
- b. Set next meeting date
 - It was discussed and agreed to that with the transition of board members, the next regularly scheduled meeting in January will be a full board meeting. Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 10th, 2017 at 3:00 PM. Meeting location will be at the North Central Public Health District office located at 419 E. The Dalles, OR.

2. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

a. Market for salary survey.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

a. None

4. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- a. Staffing Update
 - We have hired an Environmental Health Specialist Trainee who is relocating to the area from New Jersey. She will be starting mid January.

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- b. Public Health Modernization Status Update
 - Public Health Modernization was not funded in the Governor's budget released on December 16, 2016. The Public Health Advisory Board has discussed direction for the future. A group of public health advocates in Oregon will continue to work through the legislative process to obtain funding for Modernization.
 - It was asked if there is nothing in the budget does the whole process stop; are changes not funded.
 - > Teri stated that changes are not funded in the Governor's budget. We'll have to wait to see what comes out of the Legislative budget. Teri reminded the board that Oregon makes a very small investment in public health. The counties invest far more in public health infrastructure than the State does. Oregon ranks anywhere from 47th to 38th in their investment.
 - Teri further explained that the thought is, is that some of that work, if this isn't funded in this biennium it gives us time to spend more time on what the return of investment

5. **NEW BUSINESS**

- a. Salary Survey Market
 - Teri has been working with HR Answers. In conversation with them about what we want our market defined as they would like to ensure the board agrees on what that market should be.
 - It was Teri's suggestion to the board that we compare our staff to similar positions across the market in Oregon using similar size communities.
 - ✓ It was recommended by Commissioner Hege that HR Solutions use local communities rather than ones far away.
 - Teri stated that the difference will then be that HR Solutions will look at the private sector for similar positions as well as in other government markets.
 - After discussion, the board was in agreement that the salary survey would be more localized using private sector as well as other government markets.
- b. Transition of Board Leadership
 - Deferred to January 2017 board meeting.
- c. Fiscal Audit Report (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016) Presented by Hans Graichen of Pauly Rogers and Co.
 - Kathi Hall introduced Hans Graichen from Pauly Rogers & Co. He headed up the team who conducted our
 - Kathi Hall briefly went over a couple of high points of the audit.
 - Mr. Graichen explained to the board the new GASB #68 requirement of reporting pension related deferrals.
 - Results of Audit:
 - Audit opinion letter an unmodified opinion on the basic financial statements has been issued by Pauly, Rogers and Co., P.C. which means they have given a "clean" opinion with no reservations.
 - State minimum standards No exceptions or issues requiring comment.
 - Management Letter No separate management letter was issued. Did not identify any significant deficiencies.
 - Identified only one best practice regarding fidelity insurance (employee honesty) coverage.

NINTH AMENDMENT TO OREGON HEALTH AUTHORITY 2015-2017 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE FINANCING OF PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

This Ninth Amendment to Oregon Health Authority 2015-2017 Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Public Health Services, effective July 1, 2015 (as amended the "Agreement"), is between the State of Oregon acting by and through its Oregon Health Authority ("OHA") and Gilliam, Wasco, and Sherman Counties, acting by and through its Gilliam, Wasco, and Sherman Counties North Central Public Health District ("LPHA"), the entity designated, pursuant to ORS 431.375(2), as the Local Public Health Authority for Gilliam, Wasco, and Sherman Counties.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the set of Definitions set forth in Exhibit A of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to add certain Program Element Descriptions set forth in Exhibit B of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the financial assistance award for fiscal year 2016-2017 set forth in Exhibit C of the Agreement;

WHEREAS, OHA and LPHA wish to modify the Exhibit J information required by 2 CFR Subtitle B with guidance at 2 CFR Part 200;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. The Agreement is amended as follows:
 - **a.** Exhibit A "Definitions", Section 16 "Program Element" is amended to add Program Element titles and funding source identifiers as follows:

- 2. LPHA represents and warrants to OHA that the representations and warranties of LPHA set forth in Section 2 of Exhibit E of the Agreement are true and correct on the date hereof with the same effect as if made on the date hereof.
- 3. Capitalized words and phrases used but not defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed thereto in the Agreement.
- 4. Except as amended hereby, all terms and conditions of the Agreement remain in full force and effect. The parties expressly agree to and ratify the Agreement as herein amended.
- 5. This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which when taken together shall constitute one agreement binding on all parties, notwithstanding that all parties are not signatories to the same counterpart. Each copy of this Amendment so executed shall constitute an original.

Attachment A

Program Element #11: Climate Change and Public Health Program:

1. **Description.** Funds provided under the Financial Assistance Agreement for this Program Element may only be used, in accordance with and subject to the requirements and limitations set forth below, to implement interventions that build local capacity to address the public health impacts of climate change. LPHA will comply with the performance standards of this program, LPHA must engage in the activities as described in Subsections 2.a. through 2.d. below. The purpose of these activities is to build local capacity and implement interventions to address the public health impacts of climate change.

NOTE: <u>LPHA must demonstrate substantial progress toward completing the activities described below before August 30, 2017 to retain eligibility to receive funding under this Program Element in future years.</u>

2. Local Activities

- a. Participate in the Oregon Climate and Health Collaborative (OCHC). Attend and participate in regular conference calls convened by OHA. The calls will serve as a coordinating structure for the OCHC and participants will be expected to contribute to statewide activities, including the prioritization, implementation, and evaluation of statewide climate health interventions.
- b. Engage and collaborate with partners and stakeholders. Convene and facilitate a group of internal and external partners/stakeholders to assist with the prioritization and selection of interventions from pre-existing local climate and health plan and the Oregon Public Health Division's Resilience Plan.
- c. Develop and begin implementation of an intervention work plan Based on stakeholder input and OCHC guidance, develop a work plan to implement at least one prioritized intervention and begin implementation. Work closely with Oregon's Climate and Health Program to evaluate intervention during implementation.
- d. Prepare written report for OHA. Document and share major accomplishments and outcomes that are the result of this funding. Reports should include a description of methods or strategies employed, partners/stakeholders engaged, any evidence of effectiveness and lessons learned during the implementation of the selected intervention. LPHA should also discuss approaches that worked well, challenges, and limitations.
- 3. Procedural and Operational Requirements. By accepting and using the financial assistance funding provided by OHA under the Financial Assistance Agreement and this Program Element, LPHA agrees to conduct these climate and health activities in accordance with the following requirements:
 - a. Conduct all climate and health activities as described in this Program Element.
 - b. Assure that its local program is staffed at the appropriate level to address subsections 2.a. through 2.d. of this Program Element. Funds for this program element must be directed to personnel and other expenses in support of subsections 2.a. through 2.d.
 - **c.** Participate in regular conference calls with OHA and the other mini-grantees to discuss ongoing progress.
- 4. **Performance Measures.** LPHAs that complete fewer than 75% of the planned activities for two consecutive calendar quarters in one state fiscal year will not be eligible to receive funding under this Program Element in the next state fiscal year.
